Mission Statement

In June of 2009 our church was faced with the challenge of opening our doors and reaching out to families in Andover and our neighboring communities who were in need of food.

We stepped up to the challenge and decided to make it our mission to reach out to all those in need. We opened our doors to start a weekly food pantry. At that time all donations of food for the pantry came from our church members. We now have to hold a yearly fundraiser to accommodate our growing need.

Our pantry provides nearly 300 families with a weekly food supplement at two separate pantries. We were able to partner with Foodshare of Bloomfield which enables us to purchase food at a greatly reduced price, and also joined their Mobile Foodshare Program which provides us with a fresh produce and bread delivery twice a month for those in need in our community. The numbers attending the Mobile Foodshare Program are upwards of 135 in a single week. The loyalty and commitment of the volunteers who help run these two entities are astounding.
