The AHM Family Resource Center received its first grant in 1996 from the Connecticut State Department of Education and has collaborated with the four regional Elementary Schools, the Middle School and the High School in various programs and services. The philosophy of Family Resource Centers is that healthy development and good education begin with access to support services from birth. When these services are offered in schools, services are readily accepted and accessible to families. ***All FRC programs are located at Gilead Hill School, in our Family Resource Center unless a different location is noted. Programs are for children age Birth-5 and their parents/caregivers, and are facilitated by Ashlee Parks & Becky Murray unless otherwise noted.**

AHM's Coalition for a Healthy & Empowered Community (AHM CHEC) and its youth alliance, SOAR Youth Leadership Group, work towards this goal through healthy lifestyle activities and events in the community and in the schools.

AHM CHEC is made up of RHAM Middle School and RHAM High School administrators, town leaders, parents, business owners, and community members, with the focus to incorporate increased community wellness with an emphasis on helping to keep youth alcohol and drug-free.

School-Based Support Services

AHM provides school-based student support services for elementary, middle, and high school students. A Student Support Services Counselor (SSSC) is located within the school, and can be easily accessed by students for a variety of needs. Services include individual counseling, group counseling, risk assessment, crisis intervention, classroom/teacher support, parent support, referrals to outside services, peer mediation, and positive youth development programming.

Student Support Services Counselors are master's level therapists or school counselors who are professionals in the field of mental health. They are skilled in identifying a child's needs, collaborating with school staff and parents, and offering interventions designed to support each student's success.

If your child is struggling, please reach out.

We are here for you. Our counselors address these topics and more:

- Difficulty with peer relationships
- Depression, Loss, Grief, Anxiety
- Suicidal thoughts/Self harm
- Feeling overwhelmed/stressed
- School issues: Bullying, attendance/truancy
- Difficulty adjusting to a new school
- Disciplinary problems
- Family conflict
- Coping with long-term illness
- Drug or alcohol use
- Managing mental health needs
- Difficulty with school work
- Eating disorders
- Social, emotional & behavioral concerns

QPR & Narcan Training

Training will include: The Good Samaritan Law, support information and resources, and warning signs of a suicide crisis and how to respond. Participants will receive a QPR (Question, Persuade, Respond) training booklet and a 2-dose supply of Narcan, an opioid overdose treatment. FREE & open to the public for age 18+.

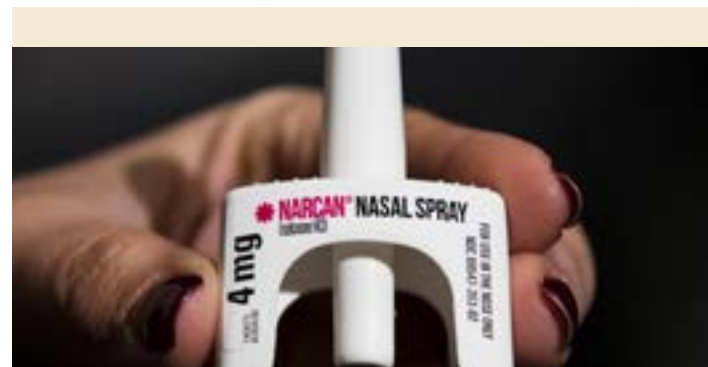

1,000 Books Distributed!

As part of an ongoing effort to help residents feel more at ease talking about mental health concerns, AHM continues to stock lending libraries of books on a range of mental health topics. To date, over 1,000 books have been placed in the little libraries!

These mental health resource libraries include books on topics such as social and emotional learning for children, coping with anxiety, getting control over anger, controlling impulsive behavior, building self esteem, and how to speak with a child or teen about depression, anxiety, and self-harm.

There are four permanently placed mental health libraries in AHM’s partner towns – Andover, Columbia, Hebron, and Marlborough. The books and guides on mental health will range from families of pre-school age children through teens, young adults, and adults.

CHOREs & TASKs Programs.....



The purpose of the CHOREs & TASKs Programs is for teenagers to help senior citizens with chores on their property such as raking, stacking wood, and weeding. Senior citizens 60+ years of age who are residents in the towns of Andover, Columbia, Hebron and Marlborough are welcome to contact their town's senior center for the application forms.

The benefits are great for both senior citizens and teenagers. Senior citizens have chores completed at no charge, while teenagers age 14-18 can earn minimum wage, earn a letter of recommendation for active involvement in the program, and learn communication, scheduling and time-management skills. A win-win!

AHM's CHOREs Program supports the towns of Andover, Hebron & Marlborough, and is coordinated by AHM Youth & Family Services. This program is funded by a grant from the NCAAA (North Central Area Agency on Aging) along with donations from Church of the Holy Family, Marlborough Congregational Church and St. Peter's Episcopal Church. Special thanks this year to Hebron's Greater Together Community Fund, and Marlborough's Greater Together Community Fund for helping to support this program.

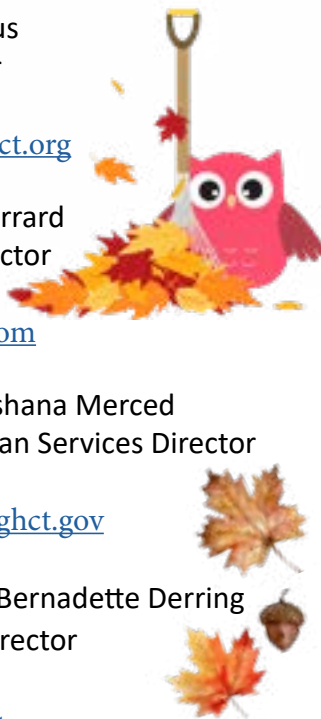

Lanterns Mentoring

Who inspired you as a child?

What if your child had a friend who listened to them, encouraged them and provided consistent, constructive one-on-one time? AHM's Lanterns Mentoring Program can help your child have this positive relationship with a caring adult. AHM's Lanterns Mentoring Program matches children in our community with adults who are eager to help them. Having a mentor is a fantastic extra resource for your child, and helps them to form a bond with a supportive adult.

The AHM Lanterns Mentoring Program is a school-based model and serves ages 5 through 18. Mentors and students meet once a week for one hour (usually during lunch and recess, or a free period) in the six schools in the towns of Andover, Hebron & Marlborough. The mentoring pairs may eat lunch together, share experiences, play games, do crafts, or play outside. Mentors and students form important friendships that inspire children to be the best they can be.

Mentors are members of our local communities who have a desire to help young people. Mentors are screened carefully and undergo a background check, reference check, and training. The Lanterns Program Coordinator is available for support, and facilitates all communication between mentors and students.

Youth who are matched with a mentor demonstrate improved self-esteem, a more positive attitude toward school, increased communication skills, decreased drug use, and improved school attendance.

Mentoring not only benefits a child, but can also help the mentor increase their leadership and communication skills. Both mentors and students in the Lanterns Program find much joy in the positive relationships formed.
